## **OLD HEALTH PROBLEMS AND SITUATIONS ADD TO COVID-19**

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One of the biggest concerns on the health area is the 2019 coronavirus pandemic (Coronavirus Disease of 2019 – COVID-19) and it's repercussion in people's life. At the beginning of 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) signaled the outbreak of a new coronavirus in China, at march, the OMS declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) with the COVID-19. Since then, many studies have been developed and published about the disease, including the need for social isolation to avoid or minimize it's exponential growth.

Despite we are living a crisis and emergency that reverberates in the social and economic areas and populational's health, the common health problems in every single region or country keep happening and deserving attention together with the current pandemic.

In this number, we are bringing works about nursery care into cardiac arrest and proper chemotherapy resources disposal. Related to this profession, we also publish the qualification theme, which is about nursing residency.

It generated the "maternal near-miss" concept, a definition established by WHO as "a woman who almost died, but survived to the complications during pregnancy, childbirth or 42 days after the pregnancy end".
